Built on the dream of a local, newly married couple, IVRT's plan was written on a napkin in a restaurant. IVRT rehearsed its first play in a living room and performed at Alta Loma High School, and 34 years later is still having fun telling stories with other people who are just as passionate.

Over the years, IVRT produced dozens of plays and musicals including *Fiddler on the Roof*, *A Christmas Carol*, *West Side Story*, *Sweeney Todd*, and others, at venues throughout the community. IVRT partnered with the Candlelight Pavilion from 2008 to 2022, producing award-winning productions of *Big Fish*, *The Man Who Came to Dinner*, *Hairspray*, *Chicago* and more.

A sneak preview of the upcoming Broadway Night gala concert, *I Heart New York!* will feature performances by all five Los Osos High School Choirs and a variety of soloists, celebrating the hard work and dedication of these young singers as they prepare to bring their work to Carnegie Hall this summer. Valverde School of Performing Arts (or VSPA) is owned and operated by the Valverde Family. VSPA was established in 2005 in Rancho Cucamonga with the goal of creating a place where students and their families can learn about, and participate in, the performing arts, without competition.

Learning how to dance, sing, act or play a musical instrument is a lifelong skill that will impact the students and their family in many ways.

VSPA produces an Annual Showcase each summer, a Winter Show called the Holiday Impromptu, 2-3 musicals per year, Spring, Summer & Fall Music Recitals, 2 Theater Department shows called Teens, Scenes & Drama Queens per year, and a Dance Drama every other year.

In addition to the school's major performance productions, there are 5 troupes that give even more opportunities for students to study, perform and hone their skills, several of which will be featured at this RCCAAF production.

VSPA believes that the performing arts builds confidence and empowers all people regardless of age, race, religion, or economic background. Have fun with the performing arts at VSPA, where there is no competition - literally!

The Rancho Cucamonga Community & Arts Foundation (RCCA AF) has been a key funding resource for the arts in Rancho Cucamonga for over two decades, when its primary focus became Community & ARTS, combining these two elements into one purpose. RCCAAF has provided significant funding for programs and productions at the Lewis Family Playhouse / Victoria Gardens Cultural Center since its opening in 2006, and has contributed thousands of dollars to support local school arts programs, and provide scholarships to local graduating high school arts students.

To provide greater support to the local arts community, RCCAAF started a Community Arts Grant Program in 2021, and in 2022 created the first (and now annual) Community Arts Festival, bringing all arts groups, schools, and business together on one day to honor and celebrate the arts. 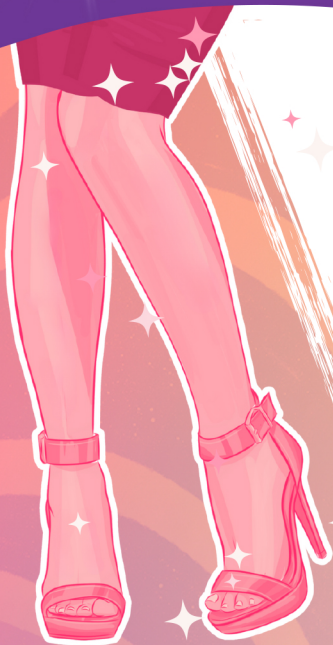
